






## QUICK BITS

 All garbage out by 6:00 am


 Garbage cart handle must face away from street.

 Keep items that could interfere with automated truck arm clear of cart.


 Green garbage cart cannot be used for yard waste.


 On holidays without collection, residents should hold items until the next scheduled pick up day.

---

 A separate truck picks up large items. The following items should be placed curbside on the 2nd garbage pick up day of the week:

 Boxes, broken down, bundled & tied.

 Bagged overflow garbage.

 Other large items such as furniture, appliances, mattresses, etc. Items must be within a size and weight to be lifted by two people.

## RECYCLING:

The following material is accepted in the curbside recycling program:

- Newspapers, Magazines & Catalogs
- Plastic Bottles - #1 through #7 (#'s on bottom of containers)
- Glass Bottles & Jars (Clear, Green and Brown)
- Aluminum Cans
- Steel Cans (Includes Empty Aerosol Cans)
- Telephone Books  
Telephone books are collected once a year, coinciding with the delivery of new directories. Please check local listing for exact dates.

### PLEASE RINSE OUT ALL CONTAINERS AND DISCARD LIDS

The following items **are not included** in Lake Mary's recycling program at this time:

- Paper or plastic grocery store bags
- Plastic motor oil, pool or pesticide containers
- Light bulbs or drink ware
- Aluminum foil or pie plates
- Paint or pesticide cans
- Styrofoam containers/egg cartons
- Plastic tubs i.e. butter/yogurt
- Cereal, soda, beer, or tissue boxes



### ELECTRONICS RECYCLING

*May be recycled at the Central Transfer Station ONLY.*

End-of-life electronics such as computers and televisions are accepted for recycling at the Central Transfer Station's Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility. Electronics Recycling is **FREE** for all Seminole County residents during normal facility open hours. Businesses may **NOT** bring electronics to the facility except during special collection events.

## SCHEDULE FOR HOUSEHOLD TRASH, RECYCLING, & YARD WASTE PICK UP

The cart must be set no more than 3 ft from the curb in an area of easy access by **6:00 am** with handles facing away from the street. The cart is issued to your residence and shall remain in the event you move. Any item that does not fit in your cart, such as furniture or boxes, will be picked up on your 2nd weekly pick-up day, provided that the item can be picked up by 2 people.

### Areas NORTH of Lake Mary Blvd:

**MONDAY:** Garbage cart, and **Recycle bins** for Timacuan, Manderley, Woodbridge, Hills of Lake Mary, Tuscany, and The Reserve subdivisions.

**THURSDAY:** Garbage cart, and **Recycle bins** for all other areas North of Lake Mary Blvd.

### Areas SOUTH side of Lake Mary Blvd:

**TUESDAY:** Garbage cart, and **Recycle bins** for areas West of Country Club Road

**FRIDAY:** Garbage cart and **Recycle bins** for all other areas South of Lake Mary Blvd.

### WEDNESDAY: YARD WASTE FOR ENTIRE CITY

Yard waste will be collected with a limit of 10 bundles/bags. Tree limbs need to be tied in bundles and cut into lengths of no more than 4 feet. Bundles, bags or containers can weigh no more than 50 lbs each. **Do not use garbage cart for yard waste.**



### NO COLLECTION:

**New Years Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas.** (On holidays without collection, residents will not have a make-up day. Hold items until your next scheduled pick up day.)

## SEMINOLE COUNTY'S SPECIAL WASTE PROGRAMS

### HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Household Hazardous Waste disposal facilities are located at the Central Transfer Station and the Landfill for many common household hazardous wastes such as: antifreeze, poisons, mercury thermometers, pool and lawn chemicals, paint, thinners, solvents, Ni-cd batteries and fluorescents and used motor oil.

(Containers **must** be labeled stating the contents). Disposal is **FREE** for all Seminole County residents. Businesses may **NOT** bring hazards to either facility.

### USED OIL

Used Oil can be disposed in Igloos at the following County Parks: Sanlando, County Softball Complex, Red Bug Lake, Lake Mills and Sylvan Lake.

### TIRES

The Central Transfer Station limits disposal to four (4) tires per person at \$1.00 per tire. At the Landfill, up to 10 tires are charged at \$1.00 per tire/\$100.00 per ton.

### SHARPS PROGRAM

For residents with conditions requiring hypodermic needles, free containers and needle disposal is offered at numerous locations throughout the County.

### CONSTRUCTION & DEMOLITION DEBRIS

May be disposed of at the Landfill **ONLY**. Common examples construction & demolition debris include: steel, glass, brick, concrete, asphalt, roofing material, pipe, wallboard, lumber; large stumps and tree branches from land clearing or tree removal.
