

SEMINOLE COUNTY'S SPECIAL WASTE PROGRAMS



HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Disposal facilities are located at the Central Transfer Station and the landfill for many common items such as antifreeze, poisons, mercury thermometers, pool and lawn chemicals, paint, thinners, solvents, rechargeable batteries and fluorescents, gasoline and used motor oil. (Containers **must** be labeled stating the contents.) Disposal is **FREE** for all Seminole County residents. Businesses may **NOT** bring hazardous waste to either facility.

TIRES

The Central Transfer Station limits disposal to four (4) tires per person at \$1.00 each. At the landfill, up to ten (10) tires are accepted at the per tire rate of \$1.00 each. More than ten (10) tires are weighed and charged at \$100.00 per ton.

SHARPS PROGRAM



For residents with conditions requiring hypodermic needles, free containers and needle disposal is offered at Lake Mary Fire Station 37 located at 911 Wallace Ct. and Lake Mary Fire Station 33 located at 145 E. Crystal Lake Ave.

CONSTRUCTION & DEMOLITION DEBRIS

Examples of construction & demolition debris include steel, glass, brick, concrete, asphalt, roofing material, pipe, wallboard, lumber, large stumps and tree branches from land clearing or tree removal and may be disposed of **ONLY** at the Seminole County Landfill.

HOUSEHOLD TRASH, RECYCLING, & YARD WASTE PICKUP

Each residence is provided with both a garbage (green) and a recycling cart (yellow lid). The carts must be set no more than 3 ft. from the curb in an area of easy access by ***6:00 am** with handles facing away from the street. The carts issued are the property of Waste Management and shall remain at the residence in the event you move or you will be charged accordingly. Any item that does not fit in your garbage cart, such as furniture or appliances, can be placed curbside on your large item collection day. **They will be picked up at a separate time by a different truck.**



LARGE ITEMS



A separate truck picks up large items such as furniture, appliances, mattresses, etc. These items should be placed curbside Thursday if you live north of Lake Mary Blvd. and on Friday if you live south of Lake Mary Blvd. All items must be within a size and weight that can be lifted by two people.



NO COLLECTION

There is no collection of any garbage/recycling on **New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas.** However, a new service will be a makeup day for garbage and recycling only. If the holiday falls on a Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday, the makeup day will be the preceding Saturday. If the holiday falls on Thursday or Friday, your makeup day will be the following Saturday.

***No carts/debris/large item shall be placed out for collection any earlier than 6:00 P.M. of the day prior to a scheduled pick up and no later than 6:00 A.M. on the day of collection and containers shall be removed no later than 8:00 P. M. on the day they are emptied.**



NEW RECYCLING INFORMATION

The following materials may now be recycled:

- Uncontaminated pasteboard (i.e., cereal boxes, empty paper towel and toilet paper rolls, soda boxes, beer boxes, tissue boxes, gift boxes, pizza boxes and shoe boxes)
- Brown paper grocery bags (no wax, no wet strength material, no liners)
- Corrugated cardboard (flattened and cut down to no larger than 3 ft. by 3 ft.)
- Newspapers, supplements, magazines and catalogs
- Printer/copier paper and junk mail
- Milk, juice, soy & broth cartons
- Plastic #1-7 (#'s on bottom of containers)
- Glass bottles and jars (clear, green and brown)
- Aluminum cans
- Steel cans and tin household containers, such as food cans

Please **empty, rinse and remove** all lids before placing in bin. Labels do not need to be removed.



The following materials may NOT be recycled:

- Plastic bags
- Electronic devices
- Microwave trays
- Mirrors
- Window or auto glass
- Light bulbs
- Ceramics, porcelain
- Coat hangers
- Glass cookware
- Cooking pots, pans, toasters
- Garden hoses
- Electrical cords
- Christmas lights
- Bottle caps
- Styrofoam egg cartons, cups and trays

Lake Mary has an exclusive franchise with Waste Management. Charges for solid waste/recycling/yard waste pickup will appear on your monthly utility bill and are treated as any other service.

QUICK BITS



All carts/debris must be out for collection by ***6:00 am** on pickup day.



Garbage cart handle must face away from street.



Keep items that could interfere with automated truck arm clear of cart. Allow space between carts for truck arm.



Waste Management provided garbage/recycle carts cannot be used for yard waste.



Flattened boxes can be recycled.



ELECTRONICS RECYCLING

May be recycled at the Central Transfer Station ONLY.

End-of-life electronics such as computers and televisions may be recycled at the Central Transfer Station's Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility. Electronics recycling is FREE for all Seminole County residents. Businesses may NOT bring electronics to the facility except during special collection events.



PERSONAL INFORMATION AND RECYCLING OF COMPUTERS

It is strongly recommended that all information be removed from the hard drives of old computers before they are recycled. Some common methods of removing personal information from hard drives include special software, or removing the hard drive and punching or drilling holes through the case.



YARD WASTE FOR ENTIRE CITY IS PICKED UP ON WEDNESDAYS

Yard waste will be collected with a limit of ten (10) bundles/bags. Tree limbs need to be tied in bundles and cut into lengths of no more than four (4) feet. Bundles, bags or containers can weigh no more than fifty (50) lbs each. **Do not use Waste Management garbage/recycle carts for yard waste as they will not be picked up.**
